Jesus and Zacchaeus

Reading the Text

- **Luke 19:1-4** Jesus entered Jericho and made his way through the town. ²There was a man there named Zacchaeus. He was one of the most influential Jews in the Roman tax-collecting business, and he had become very rich. ³He tried to get a look at Jesus, but he was too short to see over the crowds. ⁴So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree beside the road, so he could watch from there.
- Luke 19:5 When Jesus came by, he looked up at Zacchaeus and called him by name. "Zacchaeus!" he said. "Quick, come down! For I must be a guest in your home today."
- **Luke 19:6-7** Zacchaeus quickly climbed down and took Jesus to his house in great excitement and joy. ⁷But the crowds were displeased. "He has gone to be the guest of a notorious sinner," they grumbled.
- Luke 19:8 Meanwhile, Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "I will give half my wealth to the poor, Lord, and if I have overcharged people on their taxes, I will give them back four times as much!"
- **Luke 19:9-10** Jesus responded, "Salvation has come to this home today, for this man has shown himself to be a son of Abraham. ¹⁰And I, the Son of Man, have come to seek and save those like him who are lost."

- Roman tax-collecting business:
- Notorious: famous for something negative
- **Salvation:** being saved from something bad; the Biblical term referring to God saving people from the punishment of their wrongdoing.
- **Son of Man:** A name Jesus used for Himself more than any other name, quoting from the Old Testament. In the book of Daniel 7:13, the "Son of Man" is seen as a person with sovereign (divine or supernatural) authority, a messianic figure (the Savior the Jews have been waiting for), and God's Son
